1305 hrs TRH, escorted by Mr Carne and Mrs Helliwell, meet the members of Maker with Rame Parish Council (8 in total)

TRH, escorted by Mr Carne and Mrs Helliwell, enter The Rising Sun Inn (publican Mr John Moore and partner Ms Jennifer Rainbow) to meet members of the Village History group (Mr Paul Buet-Chairman, Mr Jack Spence, Mrs Cynthia Gaskell-Brown and Mr Colin Bull), RNLI fundraisers (Mr Brian Williams - Chairman, Mrs Jane Davies and Mrs Helen Walters) and Rame Peninsula Neighbourhood Watch volunteers (Mr Brian Williams and Mrs Maggie Davies, MBE).

Refreshments are available.

1320 hrs TRH, escorted by Mr Carne and Mrs Helliwell, depart The Rising Sun and walk down Market Street which is lined by pupils from Foulanesend School (headmistress – Mrs Lynette Selbie).

1325 hrs TRH arrive at The Institute on the sea front and climb the steps to enter the building to listen to the Women's Institute choir singing before viewing the Millennium tapestry and six portraits of local people by a local artist, Ms Louise Courtneil.

TRH meet the choir members and are presented with a small copy of the tapestry by Mrs Gaskin.

- 1335 hrs TRH, escorted by Mr Came and Mrs Helliwell, depart The Institute and further down the lane are invited by Mr Came to unveil a plaque commemorating their visit, fixed to the wall.
- 1340 hrs TRH walk down the lane to the Post Office. They enter and meet Mr David Magness, the sub-postmaster and Mrs Christine Magness, retail manager.
- 1345 hrs TRH walk further down the lane to Panache, which they enter, to meet Mr John Pape, owner, and local artists – Mr Russell Pond and Ms Nicci Hastings.
- 1355 hrs TRH walk along Garrett Street past the old Cornwall/Devon boundary marker.
- At Garrett steps TRH pause to take in the view across Plymouth Sound. There is a photographic opportunity.
- Further along Garrett Street, TRH meet a group of First Responders, led by Mr Bob Gaskin.
- 1410 hrs TRH are escorted to the Congregational Church (Incumbent – Rev. Jill Stephens) where members of the congregation are assembled (12 in no.), including Mrs Doll Jago, aged 93, and local children show TRH their joint project work (leader Mrs Jill Davies). Mrs Helen Briggs, Chairman of the Cornwall Historic Churches Trust (Patron: HisRH) who made a donation to the renovation of the chapel, is present.
- 1425 hrs TRH walk to The Square, Cawsand, where the community bus is parked and TRH enter the bus to meet some older residents (Chairman Mrs Jill Warwick, driver Mr Tony Rolfe). Standing by the bus are Mrs Alison Johns, Chairman, and Mr Leo Kaserer from Point Europa and Mr Richard Chapell, local maintainer of prize winning footpaths.
- 1435 hrs TRH are escorted onto the Bound overlooking Cawsand Beach to meet members of the local Gig Club (President, Mr Ivan Hooper and Mr Tony Jago, Hon. Life President) and view a gig and members of the Sailing Club (Commodore, Mr Brian Simmons and Sail Training Officer, Mrs Kathryn Boston) with a sailing dinghy. TRH then meet Mr Malcolm Baker, a local handline fisherman and Mrs Edie May (aged 88) a retired fisherman.
- 1455 hrs TRH are escorted to St Andrews Church, where they meet the Vicar, The Rev. Robin Doyle, who elaborates on the history of the Church, and members of the Parochial Church Council (Mr Peter Lavers and Mr Stephen Michael). The organ will be playing (Ms Pauline Turpitt). TRH view the work of the local flower arrangers (Mrs Joyce Smith and Mrs Margaret Lavers).
- There is an opportunity to retire.
- 1510 hrs TRH bid farewell to Mr Hutchings, Mrs Helliwell, Mr Carne and Chief Constable, Stephen Otter, and depart by car.
